Dr. Camaren Peter is an Associate Professor at the Allan Gray Centre for Values-Based Leadership at UCT GSB and Executive Head of the Centre for Analytics and Behavioural Change (CABC NPO). A trained theoretical physicist and astrophysicist, he earned his PhD from UCT GSB in 2010. As a systems and complexity theorist, he has applied complexity thinking to sustainable development, particularly urbanization challenges in the developing world.

Over the past decade, Peter has worked with various local and global institutions, publishing extensively in policy and academic circles. His 2016 book, Lazarus in the Multiple: Awakening to the Era of Complexity, explores themes such as memory, forgiveness, ethics, and the need for a new politics, aimed at leaders and strategists addressing 21st-century challenges.

- 3. In preparation for the submission, please ensure that you can select:
- The values your paper explores (Dignity/Ubuntu/Ethical governance/Ownership and Agency/Equity/Values-based Leadership)
- The stream your work relates to (solidary, equality and sustainable development)
- Select sub-stream (refer to the call for papers)
- 4. Notification of Abstract Acceptance: 20 July 2025
- 5. Full page Submission: The full paper should be submitted by 20 September 2025
- 6. Should your paper be accepted, you will present your paper at our V20 South Africa summit on the 17 October 2025. The conference will be hybrid, so participants who are not able to present in person in Cape Town, South Africa on the 17 October 2025 can present online.
- 7. Selected papers will have the opportunity to be published in conference proceedings.
- 8. Submissions should be in MS Word format and follow academic writing standards (using APA 7th edition referencing)
